**Report of the 1<sup>st</sup> Assistant Commissioner** –

I would like to start by thanking my fellow Executive Members and commend them for the hard work and dedication they continue to demonstrate, for the kids of this Zone. As our zone continued to grow the time commitment of these volunteers cannot truly be appreciated until you witness first hand the hours that are devoted.

Last years fall try-out process started shortly after the Spring AGM. With the help of the registrar, who projected registration numbers the division Coordinators were asked to identify their power skate and evaluation ice requirements. By putting in place a process to determine the zone ice requirements we were able come in approximately \$3,800 under budget.

Coaches Evaluations were forwarded to all teams in mid February. For those coaches who have not yet received a consolidated list of their evaluations, please offer their coordinator patience as compiling this information is a very big job.

Obviously the single largest change this executive undertook over the year was the splitting of the Redwing Zone. I think each and every member needs to be commended for setting aside their personal differences in what could have been a very difficult process. Everyone was willing and able to work together for the betterment of hockey within the zone as well as the entire city.

I now leave this position vacant as my area has been designated to become a part of the new zone.

**Report of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Assistant Commissioner –**

Prior to tryouts commencing we met several times with the Coordinators to review the processes used to fairly evaluate player abilities and placing them at the best level possible. This is not a perfect science, it always will have room for improvement, however we did attempt to implement a system that uses as many checks and balances as possible.

ICE allocation went well. We've reduced the cost of tryouts the last two years, this was made possible by careful allocation, but more importantly the coordinators reviewing their programs and completing their evaluations on a tight budget. Good job to our coordinators.

Mentorship program was initiated and although it may not have been utilized as much as anticipated, it was a good start and I believe we become a useful avenue.

Many thanks to everyone on the executive our volunteers the parents and most importantly our hockey players.

**Report of the Treasurer –**

After 3 years of deficits from 2002 to 2005, Fiscal 2006 was a critical year to ensure a surplus. Experienced a \$75,00 surplus.

For 2007, budgeted for a break even financial status based on player numbers of 756 and 630 families.

We ended up with 815 players and 650 families. This made for larger teams, but not necessarily more teams.

Player related costs will be about \$12,000 below budget. Other revenues also exceeded budget. The tournament committee profits were in excess of \$14,000.

As of April 15, 2007 the resulting surplus is \$76,000, as a result the overall zone surplus should be \$178,000.

SHA made some changes this year downloading more data entry from zone registrars.

I would like to thank the members of the executive, the division coordinators, coaches, managers, parents and players of the zone for their hard work and dedication to our hockey zone this season. The volunteers in this zone use a great deal of their time for the benefit of our zone and I would like to express my appreciation. I would also like to thank Greg Gelletta for his invaluable assistance again this year. I will miss many parents and players who will be with the new zone next year and would like to thank Mike Dunphy for his leadership through the difficult process of rezoning. Remember the next year's registration is less than five months away.

#### **Report of the Novice Coordinator –**

The Redwing Novice division seemed to run quite well for the 2006-07 year. We had 132 players register for Novice hockey. The zone supplied them with two power skating sessions, which were followed by three sessions that we evaluated.

The first session was to test skills and agility. Then was followed by a 3 on 3 session and a 5 on 5 scrimmage. The players were continually moved around to keep them in their appropriate groups throughout the three sessions. At the end a ranking of 1 – 132 was established. The head coaches were chosen based on an application process. These 9 coaches (3 tier I, 3 tier II and 3 tier III) then attended a draft process where teams were chosen systematically. Any changes were to be announced by the coaches during the draft and/or prior to informing the players of their placements. To my knowledge there was no complaints brought to my attention about the placements of the kids.

Throughout the season there were limited numbers of complaints/concerns brought to our attention.

The season has ended. The player and coach evaluations have been gathered were forwarded to the Assistant Commissioners. As well, we believe that all players showed some type of improvement this season according to the evaluations/comments that we received.

Finally, we believe that we will have a strong novice group again next year and we are passing on solid atom players to the Redwing zone as well as the new zone. This concludes our final report for the 2006 – 07 Redwing Novice hockey season.

#### **Report of the Atom Coordinator –**

A big thank you to all the coaches, managers and other volunteers who put in countless hours for little reward. Also a big thank you to Craig Stevenson for acting as "assistant coordinator".

The Redwing Zone had 168 registrants this year for Atom hockey. I was led to believe it was the single biggest group of players in the province.

The year started off on a somewhat negative note. With 168 players, that worked out to 11 teams. The SMHA grid called for 4 teams in each tier of Tiers 1 and 2 and 3 in Tier 3 . We were very concerned over the possible dilution of talent in Tiers 1 and 2. We concluded that the SMHA grid was incorrect in its philosophy.

We petitioned the SMHA and asked for a concession to allow for only 3 Tier 1 teams, however a meeting of atom coordinators did not approve this. It was nice to see support at that meeting though. The commissioner and both assistants, as well as myself and Craig turned out to lobby our position.

After a lengthy and tough evaluation process, we went with 12 teams, 4 in each Tier.

However, it appears that our fears were unfounded. We soon found out that the teams across each Tier were relatively competitive with each other and certainly competitive against other zones.

The SMHA indicates a .500 season is a successful season. Most teams were at or near this mark.

Though there are always negative comments, I've received many positive comments over both the evaluation process and the season in general. Though it's only been one year, I've enjoyed my time as the atom coordinator.

**Registration:**

All players will register with their zone on a first come first serve basis. The date and time that the player registers will be logged and signed by the player on a form supplied by SMHA. In the event that the zone teams are full with the required amount of players the last players to register will be moved to other zones to fill their shortage of players. All Zones will follow the same format set by SMHA.

**18 Year Olds (1989 birth year) to Play Midget Non Contact:**

A one year pilot project has been approved to allow 18 year olds to play one more year of minor hockey if they want to register with the Midget Non Contact Division. The players must have been registered with SMHA in the previous two seasons to be eligible.

**Interlock Non Contact:**

SMHA has approved pursuing interlocking Non Contact with Clavet and Martensville if the opportunity arises with these communities.

**Report of the Hockey Draft Coordinator –**

The 2006- 2007 season represented the year of the return of the draft. Although bringing back the draft translates into higher administration costs than the previous year's draw; the draft was welcomed by many. We generated revenue of over \$82,000 from the draft, which is \$7500 higher than expected due to increased family registrations and sale of drafts to non-Redwing families.

Expenses are well controlled and we expect to be on budget. We are currently forecasting a profit of over \$57,000 almost \$5,000 more than originally projected.

The draft continues to be an excellent tool for many families in offloading a portion of their player's hockey fees. This was confirmed this year with the number of families reselling their drafts to family and friends.

With the splitting of the Redwing Zone, I would recommend to everyone that the draft be shared between the Redwings and the Golden Seals. This only makes sense as both zones can minimize costs and maximize the profit to each zone. To accomplish this, both zones will have to work together to determine the best procedure.

This is my families last year as a Redwing, as we are part of the new zone. I have greatly enjoyed my time in the Redwing Zone and it has been a pleasure serving on the executive.

I would like to thank the Zone's Executive once again for their hard work and dedication of time and effort as well as those who assisted me at registration.
